ON THE LEGACY OF THE APOSTLES AND LEADERSHIP

"The Sisters of SHA were among my first role models in leadership, along with my parents. Today, I hope to continue their legacy."

I could list hundreds of skills that I gained as a SHA student in the early 1970s – how to be accepting, how to respect others, how to work together, how to recognize your own gifts while allowing those of others to shine... Yet there is one skill I didn't recognize I learned until many years later; one that was ever-present but taught through actions and examples rather than textbooks and lectures.

LEADERSHIP.

When I think back to my own SHA experience, I now recognize that the Sisters were subtly teaching us what a leader has to

do, and what skills she needs, through their words and work every day.

I discovered in the ASCJs of SHA models of leadership: prayer, kindness, respect, and friendship. As a student, I wondered how they did it. How did they see and support each student so wholly?

I learned much later that it was because they dedicated their life to following the Sacred Heart of Jesus in their vocation – and I was inspired to do the same.

I couldn't wait to become a teacher. I wanted to be that ASCJ who could deeply listen to the

young ladies in class, not just teach my subject. I wanted to help students navigate profound and challenging conversations, and empower them to share their ideas with openness.

I began teaching math in elementary school before I returned to SHA to teach math and theology. I continued in secondary education until I was called to be a principal at Our Lady of Good Counsel School, an elementary school in St. Louis, Missouri. It was there where everything I learned and experienced at SHA came to life. It was my turn to pass it on.

I found I had the skills to look at the big picture of the school and put programs in

place to help every child learn. I experienced an amazing, strong, caring, faith community in school and parish. Other Sisters, our lay staff, our pastor, and parishioners taught me what a parish community can do to bring God into our daily lives, choices, activities, and dreams.

My education in leadership continued as I finished my M.A. in

Education Administration and spent a few years as Principal of St. Rita's School here in Hamden. I'm a St. Rita's graduate, so it was amazing to be back walking those halls again, in a community alive with the love of the Sacred Heart. Leaving St. Rita's to become president at Cor Jesu Academy (CJA) in St. Louis was a challenge – but as I followed Sr. Sheila's leadership there, her many projects and innovations paved the way for me.

After 12 years at CJA, the Apostle community called me to leadership. It has been four years now that I have been privileged to be in the role of Provincial Superior for the Apostles here in the U.S.

Today, I am able to visit the many diverse Apostle ministries here in the United States: social ministries, education, healthcare, and spiritual leadership. I am not leading them, but supporting them, praying with them, listening to their goals and dreams, hopes and challenges, just as the Sisters did for me when I was a SHA girl.

I believe my journey of fusing passion with leadership is a common theme for many SHA alumnae. To today's SHA girls, I say, "take

> advantage of all that SHA offers, and you will know where God is leading you."

It takes listening every day to the world of SHA around you: in classes and assemblies, within the guidance department, through prayer and liturgy, to friends and parents.

friends and parents.

It takes honesty to find who you are and where

you want to go: honesty first with yourself, and then listening to how others see and know you. It is all there in the SHA halls – do not just build your resume, but build the WHO that will get you on the path that's right for YOU.

Like many SHA alumnae before and after me, what I learned in the classrooms has come full circle. Together, we are all part of a legacy and a future that's uncommon and groundbreaking for so many young women.

LEAPS OF FAITH AND LEADERSHIP

Even as a little girl, Margie knew she would be a teacher.

What she didn't know was that, after spending more than 40 years as an educator, she would become an entrepreneur.

"I always saw myself as a teacher. I taught my little sister to read in our basement, where we would play school every day," said Gillis, a nationally recognized literacy expert and Certified Academic Language Therapist. "I never thought about starting a business until I left a research position at the age of 57."



That's when Margie decided to take a leap of faith and launch Literacy How, Inc., which provides professional development opportunities and coaching to help teachers implement evidence-based reading practices in the classroom.

"There were challenges, and I didn't know if the business would survive – but it has! My hope is that we continue to provide the support that schools, families, and most importantly children require to be successful, in school and in life," she said.

While entrepreneurship was not always on her mind, trying new things and taking risks was part of a "can-do" attitude she said she developed throughout her time at Sacred Heart Academy and beyond.

"I joined many clubs at SHA just to try out different things – and I ultimately led some of them. In college, I continued on that path and led several educational groups as that has always been my passion," she said. "At SHA, I met many strong young women who were intelligent, kind, passionate,

and positive, and we supported each other in and out of the classroom."

Margie received her Doctorate of Education from the University of Louisville in Special Education, and she has worked at the policy level through the Connecticut State Department of Education (CSDE). She was instrumental in Connecticut's adoption of a universal screening test for K-3 students, and she serves as an advisor for many organizations, including ReadWorks.org and Understood.org. Margie is also the founder and former president of Smart Kids with Learning Disabilities and serves on many boards for education-based organizations.

"I didn't set out to lead, per se, but my passion for teaching children to read has been a vocation and as such, it has provided

leadership opportunities throughout my career."

Margie looks back at her time at SHA with fondness – especially when reflecting on one of her favorite SHA memories: her participation in the 1970 Sound of Music operetta.

"I was a freshman and played the role of Kurt (one of the Von Trapps) and my dear friend, Kris McMillan, was Greta in the show. The whole cast was amazing and the experience taught me a lot about hard work, being part of a group of dedicated young women, and having fun while working hard," she said. "We had lots of laughs, tears, and moments

when it was terrifying to be on stage in front of a live audience. I can still remember all of the feelings today!"

As an education advocate, Margie believes in the power and importance of an education that both develops academic skills and helps students form relationships with diverse groups of people.

"High school is a critical time in a person's life. There are challenges and opportunities that prepare a young woman for the world. At SHA, you enter as a girl and graduate as a young woman – and ideally, you use those four years of varied experiences to inform future decisions."

TAKING RISKS, FAILING FORWARD & BEING FUTURE-READY

After graduating from Sacred Heart Academy, Abby went on to study and work in the scientific industry, raise her children, and volunteer for various Boston organizations – all before founding a thriving product-based business that started with a friendship and a little blue pineapple design.

The day after graduating from Bowdoin College, Abby moved to Boston which was a biotech/pharma hub. She found herself working for a UK-based, global conference and publishing company in its US office, which operated in the Life Sciences space. "I fudged my way through the interview and was

hired in an entry-level position in the marketing department. With absolutely no marketing knowledge, I had to "wing it." Just a few years at the company, Abby became the marketing director and by 29 years old, she was promoted to division director, responsible for U.S. product development and marketing.

After becoming a mom, Abby stopped working to be at home with her children and in the little time that she had after they started school, she began volunteering for a Boston non-profit and got very involved with her children's Boston public school.

This is how she met her future business partner, Boston-based artist Vanessa Douglas.



"After three years of volunteering together, Vanessa showed me a little blue pineapple design that she had created on her iPad and asked me what I thought of it. In that same conversation, she also asked me if I wanted to go into business with her. She had interest in designing repeat

patterns and prints but didn't know how to commercialize her art. That's where I came in – and ultimately how Lilibridge started."

Abby and Vanessa spent the next six months thinking about potential products that might showcase the designs; estimating product costs; conducting focus groups; and talking to as many people in the industry as possible.

Nine months later, they launched their brand with a foldable beach bag they named the Lilibridge Bag. In their fourth year of business, Lilibridge offers six different products in twelve designs. They have five new items in development at the moment and they have recently launched an exciting collaboration with a pickleball racquet company.

Their products are currently sold in over 100 stores and resorts in the continental United States, Costa Rica, British West Indies, and the Bahamas.

In reflecting about her time at SHA, Abby credits the school with allowing her to concentrate on her own confidence and meaningful friendships with other girls. It sounds simple, but it is powerful. "It allowed me to fail in a safe environment without too much embarrassment (being a teenager is

hard enough), and benefit from the meaningful growth that comes from real failure. As a student at SHA, I knew if I did fail at something, I'd

have my sisters there to help pick me up."

The confidence gave Abby the courage to take risks. She started Lilibridge with her savings at 44 years old after being a stay-athome mom for nine years. "'Risk' might not be a strong enough word here! But even when I think back to my first job out of college or experiences in a new city at a young age, I did feel prepared for whatever challenge came my way and I do attribute that to my SHA foundation. I certainly wasn't fearless; however, I did have a strong sense of self. I was ready and excited for my future."

Among her many SHA experiences, Abby is thankful for the emphasis on hard work. "Whether it be academics, athletics, or the

> arts, SHA students are pushed to achieve extraordinary outcomes. I attribute this largely to the fact that the school is led and inspired by the

Apostles of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

My teachers were brilliant, strong women who had chosen a life of self-sacrifice. They instilled a strong work ethic, the proper discipline, and all the support a girl might need in order to achieve her goals and thrive."

As a Sacred Heart Academy student, Tompkins knew that art was her passion. After joining SHA for her sophomore year, she founded and served as president of the Dance Club, was cast in several school musicals, and also was on the track and field teams.

Yet when it came to choosing a Original oil painting college and ultimately a major, she felt pressure to keep art as a hobby in order to pursue a career that would create financial security.

"I did well and enjoyed the new SHA engineering course, so I decided to go for an engineering major – despite not truly knowing what it meant," said Tompkins.

In the fall of 2009, Jasmine began her collegiate studies at Rochester Institute of Technology in Undeclared Engineering Technology and ultimately found a fit with Packaging Engineering, which allowed her to combine her math skills and her love for art. After graduating, she worked as a packaging engineer for several large companies including Fisher Price, Conair, and Unilever.

It was while working for Unilever that Tompkins decided to start a "side hustle" in order to channel her artistic drive – a paint-and-sip business, where she offered group

painting lessons. Two years into the venture, the pandemic brought her business to a halt. In June 2020 Tompkins welcomed her son.

"Working full-time from home as a new parent was extremely overwhelming, but I found relief in painting in my spare time," said Tompkins. "And soon, people started noticing my work."

After selling a piece of original art to the Children's Hospital in Rochester, New York, the demand for her paintings grew steadily and Tompkins decided to leave her job and pursue her dream of being a full-time artist.

Nearly two years later, Tompkins continues to make a living with her original art. "I want to create art that allows the viewer to feel seen in their struggles, success, pain, and joys, and see their own strength through it all as well."





This event allowed our students to participate in the TSA Nationals held in Dallas, TX from June 26-30, 2022. Participating in these competitions not only expanded their horizons but also helped them to meet and interact with their STEM peers from across the country.

SHA GIRLS STUDY THE ACE2 GENE


Found to serve as the receptor for SARS-Cov-2 virus, the pathogen that causes COVID-19.

Sacred Heart Academy's Honors Biotechnology Research class(2021-2022) chose to study the Angiotensin converting enzyme – 2 (ACE2) gene from Bos Taurus (cow). The ACE2 gene which normally acts as a negative regulator of the RAS system (responsible for controlling blood pressure and fluid volume) in humans as well as cattle, has also been found to serve as the receptor for SARS-Cov-2 virus, the pathogen that causes COVID-19.

The class analyzed Exon 1 of the ACE2 gene (from Bos Taurus) which codes for residues that interact with the viral Spike protein in the hope that it could possibly help us to understand the reason underlying the difference in COVID-19 susceptibility seen between

The class presented their research at the Experimental Biology, 2022 meeting in Philadelphia and their work was well received. Upon completion of the project, the class was also able to submit these sequences to GenBank (the National Library of Medicine sequence database). With this addition, Sacred Heart Academy now has 35 sequences in GenBank.

Cheerleading impressed crowds at the NDWH football games and finished out a great season of performances and got ready to prep for competition season.






Cross Country finished the regular season undefeated and finished 3rd in the CIAC tournament and 4th in the SCC tournament.
